1. Important Academic Deadlines

- **Withdraw Deadline** – **November 20** is the last day to withdraw from the university without academic penalty.
- **Graduating in December** – If you are graduating in December, be sure to apply for graduation in your Student Center portal. You can use History Advising walk-in hours if you want to review your graduation record. You should run a copy of your DARS report and read it carefully. It can help you determine your readiness for graduation. This should be done by the end of September.
