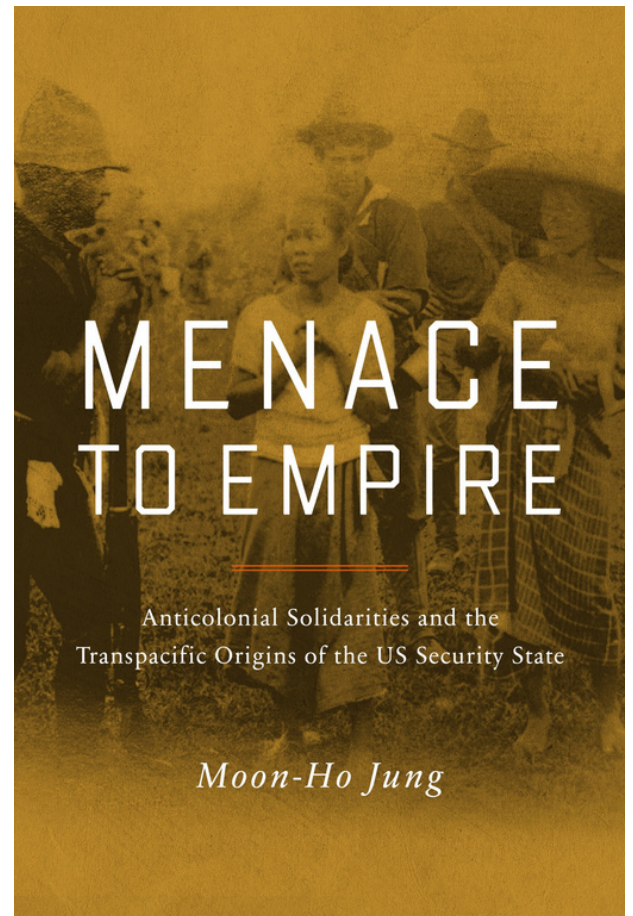


# MENACE TO EMPIRE:
